The Baptism of the Lord/ El Bautismo del Señor  
January 13, 2019 / Enero 13, 2019

**REFLECTION**



The Reflection liturgical feast of the Baptism of the Lord concludes the Church's celebration of Christmas. It helps to remind us that Jesus was born to be our Savior. His baptism marks the beginning of

his public ministry which culminates in his paschal sacrifice, his death and resurrection. Jesus was born to die. He came into the world to offer himself in a perfect sacrifice to his heavenly Father for the salvation of the whole world.

Jesus was baptized in the Jordan by John not because the Lord was sinful but because he wished to join himself to sinful humanity. It is also a sign of his self-emptying, ultimately achieved in his suffering and death on the cross. This gesture of self-emptying is made by Jesus and immediately afterwards the Spirit descended upon him. The Spirit who had hovered over the waters of the first creation descends on the Christ as a prelude of the new creation and the Father reveals Jesus as his beloved Son.

Baptism makes us a new creation. By our baptism, we are incorporated into Christ and become adopted children of God. St. Gregory Nazianzus said, "Let us be buried with Christ by Baptism to rise with him; let us go down with him to be raised with him; and let us rise with him to be glorified with him." St. Hilary said, "Everything that happened to Christ lets us know that, after the bath of water, the Holy Spirit swoops down upon us from high heaven and that, adopted by the Father's voice, we become sons of God."

We are joined as brothers and sisters of Jesus as part of God's family and we share his destiny. Baptism begins our journey up to Jerusalem with Christ to share in his Paschal Mystery. The journey will culminate for us, as it did for Jesus, with death and resurrection. But the Christian life is a constant, relentless journey with Christ up to Jerusalem.

The church, our place of worship, is our Jerusalem. Our gathering every Sunday is the enduring characteristics of the sons and daughters of God. The Eucharist is our paschal sacrifice, our sacrament of sharing in the death and resurrection of Christ.

We become children of the light called to spread the Good News of salvation by our actions of humility living in justice, love and peace of the kingdom of God.

**REFLEXIONES**



La fiesta litúrgica del Bautismo del Señor concluye la celebración de la Navidad de la Iglesia. Es útil recordarnos que Jesús nació para ser nuestro Salvador. Su bautismo marca el comienzo de su ministerio público que culmina en

su sacrificio paschal, su muerte y resurrección. Jesús nació para morir. Él vino al mundo para ofrecerse en un sacrificio perfecto a su Padre celestial por la salvación de todo el mundo.

Jesús fue bautizado en el Jordán por Juan, no porque el Señor era picador sino porque deseaba unirse a la humanidad pecadora. También es un signo de su auto-vaciamiento, que finalmente se logró en su sufrimiento y muerte en la cruz. Jesús hizo este gesto de auto-vaciamiento e inmediatamente después el Espíritu descendió sobre él. El Espíritu que había flotado sobre las aguas de la primera creación desciende sobre el Cristo como prelude de la nueva creación y el Padre revela a Jesús como su Hijo amado. El bautismo nos hace una nueva creación. Por nuestro bautismo, nos incorporamos a Cristo y nos convertimos en hijos adoptivos de Dios. San Gregorio Naziano dijo: "Seamos sepultados con Cristo por el Bautismo para resucitar con él; bajemos con él para ser resucitados con él; y levantémonos con él para ser glorificados con él". San Hilario dijo: " Todo lo que le sucedió a Cristo nos permite saber que, después del baño de agua, el Espíritu Santo se abalanza sobre nosotros desde lo alto del cielo y que, adoptado por La voz del Padre, nos convertimos en hijos de Dios.

Nos unimos como hermanos y hermanas de Jesús como parte de la familia de Dios y compartimos su destino. El bautismo comienza nuestro viaje hasta Jerusalén con Cristo para compartir su misterio paschal. El viaje culminará para nosotros, como lo hizo para Jesús, con la muerte y la resurrección. Pero la vida cristiana es un viaje constante e implacable con Cristo hasta Jerusalén.

La iglesia, nuestro lugar de culto, es nuestra Jerusalén. Nuestra reunión todos los domingos son las características perdurables de los hijos e hijas de Dios. La Eucaristía es nuestro sacrificio paschal, nuestro sacramento de compartir en la muerte y resurrección de Cristo. Nos convertimos en hijos de la luz llamados a difundir la Buena Nueva de la salvación a través de nuestras acciones de humildad viviendo en justicia, amor y paz del reino de Dios.
